"Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 18:20)





Have you ever stopped to think about what your purpose in life is? What were you created for? When you hear the word "purpose" what comes to mind? Do you feel anxiety creeping in? Do you become overwhelmed by the idea of not having figured out what your "purpose" is? Do you recall certain nights where you prayed over and over for God to reveal His purpose for your life? The truest desire of humanity is to be loved and to have purpose, so it is natural for us to question the purpose for our life. The truth of the matter is that the Creator of the universe has a great purpose for your life. You did not simply happen but are "fearfully and wonderfully made" by God the Father who has great plans for you! (Psalm 139:14)

I can only imagine the feelings of lost hope and fear on the day that Jesus hung on a cross to bear the sins for all mankind. I can only imagine the disciples watching the Savior of the world crucified next to criminals. I can only imagine the disciples feeling lost and without purpose when the man they had followed for so long was suddenly gone. I can only imagine the feeling of darkness in the air as He took His last earthly breath.

There are times in our earthly life where we do not see the light at the end of the tunnel or the bigger picture or a simple glimpse of hope. The day that Jesus hung on a cross, I do not believe the disciples saw past what was right in front of them: the crucifixion of their King. There are many times in my life where I have called out to God out of confusion, pain, and fear and asked Him if this is what He has for my life. In most cases, our experiences with 'purpose' has been tied to our vocation, our work. Have you ever prayed for God to reveal your destined career? I have. Your work is important to God and He has purpose for our profession, but our profession is not tied to WHY we were created.

When Jesus reveals Himself to the disciples as the God who defeated death, He reveals His authority over our lives. He says, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me (Matthew 28:18)."

I pray you find rest in that. He continues with a command, "Therefore, Go" (Matthew 28:19). He has established His authority and has empowered us into action. This is can be the beginning of you walking in your true purpose, testifying of all Jesus has done for you, sharing His love to a stranger or a friend, surrendering your plans for His.

Like the disciples, we may feel defeated and lose hope, but take heart and be patient because His plans are greater and the miracle of Sunday is waiting for you.
